Thank God for His most wonderful gift!

It is important to understand that how you view God is crucial to how you see yourself and others. **Matthew 1:23 -** "Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel," which is translated, "God with us." My friend, God revealed to us in the Old Testament that He would come as both man and God in the person of Jesus Christ. "God with us!"

We read in **Hebrews 1:1-2** – "God, who at various times and in various ways <u>spoke in time past</u> to the fathers by the prophets, has in these last days spoken to us by His Son..."

God's truth was obviously not given all at one time, and the varying stages of revelation show that He has worked in different ways at different times. We see this clearly in the Old Testament and in the New Testament.

You see, the people of Old Testament times had a covenant view of God. Within five specific covenants, there are two types, conditional and unconditional. A conditional covenant is one in which God has required the people to fulfill certain obligations **before** He fulfills His promise(s).

A key phrase or formula to look for would be one such as, "IF you do this ... THEN I'll do this."

**Exodus 19:5** – "Now therefore, **if** you will indeed obey My voice and **keep** My covenant, **then** you shall be a special treasure to Me above all people; for all the earth is Mine."

You could say conditional covenants are "IF" covenants like the Mosaic Covenant.

It was a temporary contract that detailed God's laws for the nation of Israel, and **it was to only continue until** the coming of the Promised Seed Jesus Christ

Paul says in Galatians 3:16 – "Now to Abraham and his Seed were the promises made. He does not say, "And to seeds," as of many, but as of one, "And to your Seed," who is Christ."

So, the people in the Old Testament had a covenant view of God, rather than a parent-child view of God the Father. If, obey, keep, **(then)** you shall be.

Then Jesus came! Everything changed! Jesus fulfilled the demands of the law and we are inlawed to Christ because we are in Christ! It is longer if you keep the law, instead you are forever in Christ! It is finished!

Celebrate this Christmas with the full understanding of the birth of our Savior Jesus!
