One of the greatest portions of God's Word in my mind is that which depicts Jesus loving His disciples in spite of the fact that He knew all they would do.

Jesus said this, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another, even as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another." John 13:34-35

When you look back at the events preceding this passage, you see that Jesus had humbled Himself in washing the disciples' feet.

Charles Ryrie said this, "This dramatic scene of the foot-washing is an acted parable, a lesson in humility, and a vivid portrayal of Christ's self-humiliation."

So, this was the scene, the atmosphere, when Jesus said, "... love one another, even as I have loved you."

And one of these disciples was Judas, the one who would betray Him, and Peter, the one who would deny Him publicly three times. Jesus knew they eventually would all leave Him. Remember, that later in the Garden of Gethsemane, the disciples ran from Him.

Then all the disciples left Him and fled. "But all this was done that the Scriptures of the prophets might be fulfilled.' Then all the disciples forsook Him and fled." Matthew 26:56

But, John said in John 13:1 "... having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end."

My friend, how do you explain this apart from the highest form of love, God's own love? What does this really have to do with us today? Think about it, this love, according to the Bible is in you and me.

Romans 5:5 – "... and hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out within our hearts through the Holy Spirit who was given to us."

This love, my friend, gives us a soul winner's heart. It is this love that gives us the disciple maker's heart. It is this love that constrains us to love God and serve God with all of our heart, soul and mind.
