I have just returned from leading 19 people in retracing the journeys of the Apostle Paul. Praise the Lord and what a dream come true for me!

Three years ago I led a group to Israel on a pilgrimage to see where Jesus was born, lived, and taught. It was wonderful to be in the Holy Land, where Jesus was crucified, buried, and raised from the dead, and where He ascended back into heaven from the Mount of Olives. There is just something about being in these places that resonates in the heart. The Bible teaches us that Jesus came to fulfill the law and the prophets. Everything written about the Messiah (Jesus) comes true just as God tells us in His Word.

Jesus said, "Do not think that I came to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I did not come to abolish but to fulfill." Matthew 5:17

The same is true with the writings of the Apostle Paul. Think about it, Paul wrote most of the New Testament. Many commentators say, "It's as if Paul had the last word." It was Paul who stood before the Gentile philosophers in Athens. At that time it was said about the City of Athens, there were more gods to worship than men. They even worshipped what they called The Unknown God. Paul stood before them at a place we know today as Mars Hill. I climbed up this hill, and stood there, just thinking of what Paul must have felt as he was being questioned with no friends to stand and support him, all alone in this world-renowned city. He must have felt alone in one sense, but in another sense God's Holy Spirit was in Him, reasoning in his mind and speaking with his lips.

On another day, we stood where Paul stood, before the judgment seat in the market place of the City of Corinth. A place we also call "the bema." The Jews were looking for a reason to kill him because Paul was teaching the real truth about Jesus, the only one and true Messiah who had already come into the world, died for our sins, and rose again on the third day just as He said He would.

The Bible also speaks about something that is still in the future, the Judgment Seat of Christ also known as the "bema." (Romans 14:10-12; 1 Corinthians 3:10-4:5; 2 Corinthians 5:1-10)

Only church age saints will appear at this judgment. "For we must all appear before the Judgment Seat of Christ." 2 Corinthians 5:10
