Thank you for praying for me while I was away in New Jersey, preaching at a Bible Conference that has been in existence for more than 100 years. I brought a series of Bible messages entitled "Joy in the Journey." These messages were a call to absolute surrender so that we may experience joy in our earthly pilgrimage.

My friend, have you come to the point of realization that your life here on earth is short compared to eternity? As a child of God, this is not your home. The Bible teaches us that we are pilgrims.

Philippians 3:20 – "For our citizenship is in heaven, from which we also eagerly wait for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ..."

Ephesians 2:19 – "Now, therefore, you are no longer strangers and foreigners (on earth), but fellow citizens (our eternal home in heaven) with the saints and members of the household of God..."

This is how Thayer defines the word pilgrim: "One who comes from a foreign country into a city or land to reside by the side of the natives. One who stays in a place as a stranger or visitor; to describe Christians whose final citizenship is in heaven and who are regarded as temporary dwellers on earth." You see, we are here for a little while and like Jesus, we will go to heaven. Like the old song says... "we are pilgrims passing through." What did Jesus do during His short 33 years upon this earth? He made disciples and He died on the cross. What are we to do?

Matthew 28:19-20 – "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you…"

The Bible teaches that Jesus set His face like a flint towards Jerusalem and for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. My friend, this same Jesus lives in you. As a child of God, you have the joy of our Savior.

The Apostle Paul said in 1 Corinthians 12: 4-7 – "There are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are differences of ministries, but the same Lord. And there are diversities of activities, but it is the same God who works all in all. But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to each one for the profit of all."

I often encourage others to live a surrendered life. My friend, there is joy in the Christian life when we surrender to God's perfect will and not our own human will. It is only as we surrender that we will come to understand the reasons God created us, and His divine purpose for our daily living. We will find life at its very best, and God will use each of us for His perfect will and plan, which will bring Him honor and glory.
